11/12/1941 – 17/06/2022

Malcom was known to all Hahndorf residents and businesses as the very active Chairman of the Hahndorf Community Association. His frustration and passion when he became ill, was to ensure that the \$250 million of government funding quarantined for Hahndorf Bypass was honoured, and that without taking out any homes, a decision was reached and work commenced by now. We, as residents, must continue that fight as consultation has been well completed.



Malcom wore many hats in our district and beyond. He was a member of St. Paul's Homes Board; St. Paul's Church Management Committee; Life Member of National Trust and therefore Hahndorf and Mt Barker Branches; Member of the Liberal Party SA Branch and active in Kavel; The Lobethal Harmony Choir; The Aldgate Combined Probus Club; and a hands on person around town and at the school when a job needed to be done. Malcom will be remembered as a loving, generous and talented man, who was an innovator and a gifted visionary with a tremendous strength of character.

The thoughts and the thanks of this community go to Malcolm's wife Janet, his family and close friends.

PROTECT
our **HERITAGE**

presented a 14,000 signature to the parliament, calling for a review and reform of the disastrous new Planning and Design Code. Through his efforts, he will share in the legacy of a re-newed recognition of the need to protect our South Australian heritage.

hca happenings

Sadly, as many are aware, our hard working Chairman, Malcolm Kentish passed away mid-June. Malcolm was known to all Hahndorf residents and businesses as our very active leader. He wore many hats in our district and beyond, but was also a hands on person around Hahndorf when a job needed to be done. We have lost a valuable and significant community member who fought like a true warrior for the betterment of our Hahndorf community. He is sadly missed.

Hahndorf Township Access Upgrade Project

It is no secret that residents are frustrated with the lack of communication and information in relation to this very important project. The Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) website shows that the preferred option for the route(s) will be determined "Early 2022" and be followed by "Community consultation on detailed project design" 2022 to 2023. Given that it is now August (time of writing) and there has not been a release of a preferred option, I opted to ring DIT to obtain the latest information to share with you. After nine minutes of electronic hold music, a person answered and moments later the line dropped out. A second call finally resulted in a commitment for "someone to contact me inside the next 48 hours", and I'm still waiting...

HCA Membership - All adult Hahndorf permanent residents are automatically members of the HCA. There is no charge. We have a rich diversity of age, ethnicity, experience and skills in our community and all are welcome at our short monthly meetings. Your involvement and opinion is valued and helps strengthen the bonds in our small community. Councillors from the Council are usually in attendance and provide valuable updates and insights into Council activities relevant to Hahndorf. Please consider attending our meetings which are held in, the Hahndorf Institute, and exercise your pride in, and commitment to, our wonderful village life. The next meeting is September 14th at 7:30pm and our Annual General Meeting is October 12th, 2022 at 7:30pm.

Environmental Grants - The HCA has initiated and managed two relatively recent successes in gaining and implementing Environmental Grants through the Mount Barker District Council. Community volunteers aided by MBDC personnel have beautified a small open space on the corner of Balhannah Road and Stempel Avenue. Another group of volunteers have cleaned up, weeded and planted out the banks of a waterway in Byard Place. We extend our thanks and hearty congratulations to all involved.

Public Open Space - Unlike other towns in the Hills, Hahndorf has a significant lack of public open space within the township. We continue to lobby Council to not sell what little land it owns in our town and to commit and engage in discussions to find innovative ways to address the issue. Where do you go in Hahndorf township to kick a ball, exercise your dog, fly a kite or take a walk away from traffic? Understandably both schools have taken steps to contain use of their ovals to school activities. The public health benefits of having public open space in your neighbourhood are well documented. The HCA will continue to pursue addressing the important issue with Council.

Hello Hahndorf Community. By now you may have noticed a few recent changes to the Hahndorf CFS station. During 2022 the station has undergone several large improvements, which are in line with the brigades vision to modernise and provide residents and tourists with an engaging and interactive station. To date improvements have included; installation of three new electric roller doors with glass viewing panels, allowing you to view inside our engine bay where our appliances are stored; a roof restoration with a new paint job, including the shed; a new kitchen and some modernised training capabilities. Keep your eyes open for further future improvements!

The town siren is in the process of receiving a software and hardware upgrade, it will be back online in time for the 2022-2023 fire danger season. The siren will sound for select emergencies during daytime hours only. It may also be activated manually during fire danger season to alert the community of an emergency or for testing on Monday night training.

We are currently seeking new members, in particularly anybody that has the capacity to offer day time (9am-5pm) availability. If you have ever thought about volunteering or wanted to know more, please drop in on a training night and say hello – Monday nights from 7.30pm. The CFS offers a range of roles including:

- Firefighter
- Radio operations
- Catering
- Community education
- Administration support
- Operational support
- Fundraising

You will work side by side with other volunteers in times of emergency and learn new and valuable skills that will help you in day-to-day life and in your workplace. Most of all, you get to help make your community a safer place to live in and enjoy the support from your community for your efforts.

Creek Project Moving Forward

In 2021 the HCA Committee was inspired by the AGM speaker, Sheree Bowman (Chair of Nairne Landcare Group) to work on restoring part of the creeks in Hahndorf. The area chosen was Alec Johnston Park where two creeks join and where the local primary school has already made a significant start. Because the area is Council property, we needed to get Mt. Barker Council involved and we have been liaising with them since. Now a plan is being developed by Council to decide what can be done, firstly by them, and then by the residents. The HCA has also been liaising with local service clubs to enlist their help and support for the project. In the near future we will be asking for any local residents who are interested in working with us to further the work on cleaning up our town creeks - starting with the area in Alec Johnston Park which will be weeding and planting appropriately elected plants.

HAHNDORF MOVES TO SOUTH WARD

In 2021, Council undertook a Representation Review which comprised of an examination of the ward structure and composition of council to ensure electors were being fairly represented. Council will retain a 3 ward structure (South, Central and North) with an elected Mayor and 10 councillors. However ward boundaries have been adjusted, including Hahndorf moving from the North Ward to the **South Ward**. South and North Wards will now be represented by 3 councillors while Central Ward will continue to have 4 councillors.

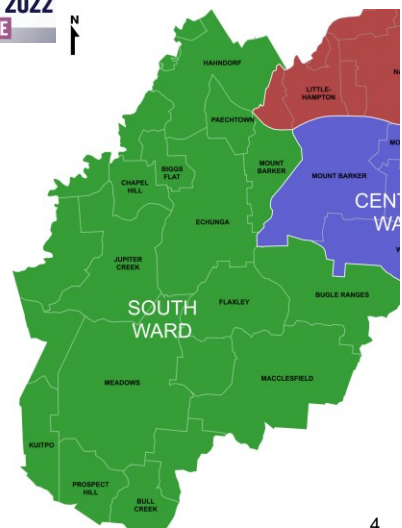

NATIONAL TRUST South Australia

The Hahndorf Branch National Trust, established in 1976, was ahead of its time in advocating for the conservation of Hahndorf as a significant historical area.

Community activism over a decade was met with a lot of opposition and the refrain of "you can't stop progress." Perhaps not, but it is possible to stop demolitions, slow progress and push for heritage legislation that encompasses defined state heritage areas...and we did it!

Hahndorf, as the oldest surviving German settlement in Australia, was designated a State Heritage Area in 1988. Nineteen individual State Heritage Places were listed throughout the town.



Heritage Area Guidelines for Development are the instruments used to assess development applications that impact on heritage places and areas.

Since the new State Planning Code has come into play, it is apparent that existing Heritage Guidelines are no longer fit for purpose and are being upgraded to Heritage Standards.

The first Heritage Standards to be developed under the new planning system are Heritage Standards (Colonel Light Gardens State Heritage Area).

The standards are an instrument under the Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016, and a supplementary assessment tool linked to the State Heritage Area Overlay in the Planning and Design Code.

The Colonel Light Gardens community played an active role in council/government engagement and consultation to develop the Heritage Standards that form a key part of Heritage SA's assessment of development proposals. Converting guidelines to Heritage Standards for Development provides an opportunity for the Hahndorf community to be actively involved in protecting Hahndorf Heritage.

- * Clean and polished floors in both halls.
- * LED lighting.

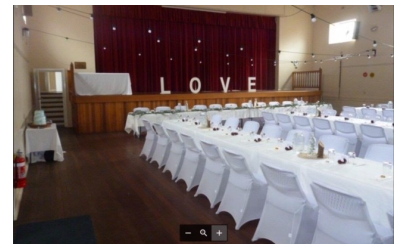
The major current project is Disability and Access inclusion to both halls for all persons. For this we seek your input and advice.

The St Michael's Junior Learning Community had another fabulous day out in early August, discovering more about how people's stories help us to understand the past. We visited 'The Cedars' and were very lucky to learn about Hans Heysen and the work he did capturing our past.



Fauna Housing for the Byard Place Habitat Project

Have you visited the Beautification and Habitat Project in the Park at the corner of Auricht Road and Byard Place yet? If you have, and looked up into the beautiful eucalypt trees, you will have noticed that a number of nest boxes have been installed to provide nesting options for local fauna. A working bee of local residents was held in July to assemble 7 nest box kits, which was a fun if challenging exercise! A week later, resident Glyn bravely climbed the extension ladder to install them. The boxes will provide safe nesting places for ringtail and brushtail possums, parrots and a roosting place for microbats. Residents have already seen parrots checking out the accommodation, and we hope they move in and raise their young there soon.

Meanwhile, the extra native plants donated by Valley Nursery were planted once the ground was moist enough, and the plants are thriving with the rain and some sunny days boosting growth. We should see a burst of flowers and growth when Spring arrives, and small birds and bees are already checking out the plants for nectar. Top marks go to Alison, Byard Place's expert weeder, for her ongoing efforts to keep weeds in the Project garden under control. We are liaising with Council to obtain more mulch to retain moisture and reduce weed infestation, and have other plans to continue beautification of the area, including tidying the Park area between Byard Place and Nicholas Paech Drive.

Personally this has been such a rewarding project knowing it has benefitted locals both of the human kind but also the flora and fauna kind. If you have an area in your street that would benefit from community involvement, do get in touch with the HCA to discuss how best to get your project underway.
